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Explore the world in the artwork – What do you see?

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Explore the world behind the artwork – Where/When was it made? Who made it?

- What do you know about the time and place this artwork was made and the artist? How do you know this? What does this information add to your understanding of the artwork?

Explore the world in front of the artwork – How is it presented? What is your opinion?

- Observe how the artwork is displayed in the Gallery. What links can you find between this artwork and others displayed with it? What does this add to your understanding of the artwork?

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- What is your personal response to the artwork? What meanings or ideas does it suggest to you? What makes you think this?

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- What do others think of the artwork? Consider the opinion of friends, teachers, gallery staff, written or audio commentaries
